#### Discussion and Possible Vote on June 2021 Financial Statements

Lance presented the following report on the June 2021 Financials:

Another fiscal year is in the books, and despite the many uncertainties faced throughout the year, the hospital finished financially in good position. For June the hospital finished with 25 admissions; 554 outpatient discharges, including 14 surgeries; 295 ER visits; 342 home health visits; and 1,568 clinic visits. Additionally, there were 9 observation admissions. This utilization resulted in gross revenue of just over \$2M, exceeding budget by about 13.5%. Please note a large amount of this overage was in the ER and thus required an increase in the allowances to offset the lower payments. As a side note, most of the outpatient/ER revenue is allowed for on average at about 80%, while the inpatient revenue is allowed for at around 25-30%. The average daily census was 3.9 patients, with an average length of stay of 4.4 days. These utilization numbers, combined with the expenses, resulted in a rather large \$325,000 loss from operations.

For year-over-year comparison:

- Gross revenue is about 14% higher than last year, resulting in allowances being up about 15% due to the revenue mix and longer length of stays. Expenses are up about 10%.
- The ADC is down 15% from last year.
- Admissions are down about 7%.
- The ALOS is down .4 days.
- Outpatient discharges are up 22%.
- ER visits are up 12%.
- Ambulance calls are similar.
- Obs admissions are down 18%.
- O/P surgeries are down 30%.
- FTEs are down slightly.
- Clinic Operational Loss up to \$375,000 from \$320,000.

On the non-operating revenue front, the hospital benefited from QIPP payments from the payments for Year 4 May. For the month, the hospital recorded a \$237,000 benefit from QIPP. These payments are included near the bottom of the income statement, now under non-patient revenue. Additionally, I accrued the quarter 3 expected payments (Mar-May) and the June monthly payments in order to record them in the proper year. This accrual was about \$535,000. Due to this accrual, there most likely will not be any QIPP benefit on the July financial statements. June is also the month the business office and social work department finalize the charity for the year. You will note that most of the charity was already written off to bad debt, thus there is a minimum effect to the bottom line as it is simply reclassified. As we have discussed previously, the increase in charity will hopefully increase future uncompensated care payments.

Overall expenses exceeded budget by about 15%. With the window closing on June 30 to make purchases with COVID funds, I had the department heads purchase additional PPE and testing kits. This is reflected in the supplies and expenses line item. Consultant fees were over budget due to utilizing travelers in physical therapy.

Overall, the loss from operations of over \$2.8M has been offset by the supplemental payments (QIPP, UC, DSRIP) of almost \$5M.
